PROGRAM HISTORY



The Ontario Blue Jays have existed since 1996, started in part by the Toronto Blue Jays to foster the development and promotion of Canadian baseball players.

Over the years the organization has grown into the year-round program that is now considered one of the top elite programs in North American amateur baseball. The Ontario Blue Jays main goal is to help players develop and obtain scholarship or professional baseball opportunities.

Over the last 15 seasons, every player who has graduated from the Ontario Blue Jays has received an opportunity to continue their education on scholarship in the United States. In addition, the Ontario Blue Jays have had in excess of 95 players selected by Major League Baseball teams in the annual draft and have had 5 alumni in the big leagues with several others knocking on the door. In the 2013-14 academic year Ontario Blue Jays graduates received in excess of \$850,000 USD in scholarships.

As well, at present the Ontario Blue Jays have the most players of any Canadian baseball organization playing on Team Canada with 11 players being chosen to the Junior National Team in the 2015 season. The Ontario Blue Jays also had 5 graduates play for Team Canada at the 2004 Olympics in Athens, Greece, 4 graduates on the roster for the last Olympics where baseball was played in 2008 in Beijing and also 3 players on the recent Pan-Am Gold Medal Championship team in Toronto.


Director of Baseball Operations/Head Coach, Dan Bleiwas, presently also a scout with the Cincinnati Reds essentially runs the daily operation of the organization & has been doing so since the fall of 2000. High-level instruction is a main component of the Ontario Blue Jays program. Sean Travers, our director of player development implements our instructional program. Travers, who played professionally and at Dallas Baptist University oversees a dedicated group of instructors who work with the players year-round including the fall development



program and during our indoor winter instructional sessions.

Please see our staff section for more information on our coaches and instructors. The primary manner in which we help our players achieve their goals is through intensive year-round training. This starts with having our own indoor training centre which is the largest indoor baseball only facility in Ontario. Check out the facility section of this booklet for more information.






PROGRAM OVERVIEW



The Ontario Blue Jays program starts annually after Labour Day and runs through the following summer, culminating with post- season play for each of our summer teams. Starting with the 2015-16 season the Ontario Blue Jays will operate full-time teams from the 10 and under age group all the way through the at the 18 & under level. The Ontario Blue Jays also offer a Development Program, which consist of players who will train with the program in the fall, winter and Spring Training before return to their local communities to play for the summer season.

Our 18 & under team undertakes an ambitious fall schedule competing against top US colleges and universities. This fall schedule is considered to be the top schedule amongst amateur teams in both Canada and the U.S. as we travel and compete against universities and their actual varsity teams. Please see the "Wall of Excellence" section in this Excellence" section in this booklet to view some of our past and present opponents. During our fall program for

our 18 & under team, players travel extensively and not only play top universities but also see and tour some of the finest campuses in North America. This phase of our program is designed to prepare our student-athletes for the rigours of college life both on and off of the field and in particular in the classroom. Players participating in the fall are subject to mandatory study hall hours and grade checks. Our players also have tutorial assistance available if needed. to supervise and lead our players through their position specific


strength and conditioning program. Please note that the Ontario Blue Jays new Clubhouse Indoor Training Centre will open in November 2015 and will be state of the art in all regards. Please see the facility section of this package for more information. All of our remaining teams undertake a specific fall program that combines individual and team instruction with intersquad game play.


This program is designed to incorporate elements of the professional baseball's fall

instructional league as well as NCAA Division 1 fall baseball where the primary focus is personal development for the players. To achieve this we limit outside competition and conduct the training and intersquad game play in a manner where we can instruct and practice areas of need. The final weekend of the fall affords our teams an opportunity to travel to the United States to play top competition in an effort to show the progress they've made over the course of earlier weeks of the fall program. Following the conclusion


of fall ball, our teams will have a short break to allow the players to rest physically and mentally before commencing our off-season program.

The off-season will begin in mid-November with our older players working on strength and conditioning and our younger players focusing on conditioning and baseball specific instruction. Following the Christmas break we ramp up our workouts to include all aspects of baseball as well as strength and conditioning (for the age appropriate groups) in an




effort to prepare for Spring Training. Over the March break all teams will have the opportunity to travel to Florida for Spring Training at the Historic Dodgertown complex in Vero Our players get to Beach. experience all aspects of a Major League Spring Training at the former home of the Los Angeles Dodgers. From first-class fields, to chef prepared meals and top-notch competitions, our players will have a chance to practice extensively and play age appropriate U.S. competition while they are on their school vacation.

Following spring training, our teams return to training at our Clubhouse until the start of our Canadian Premier Baseball League (CPBL) schedule at the end of April. We continue play in Ontario until our players finish the school year as we seek to win the CPBL Championship each season.

Once school is out, we start an extensive travel schedule which see us go to

tournaments in places such as Oklahoma, Florida, Kentucky, Indianapolis, South Carolina, Georgia, Tennessee, Ohio, Michigan and New York, concluding with our Regional Tournaments or other post-season events as our teams attempt to go to the Connie Mack World Series in Farmington, New Mexico at the 18 & under age group and the Mickey Mantle World Series in McKinney, Texas at the 16 & under age group both of which are sanctioned by the American Amateur Baseball Congress (AABC).

SPRING TRAINING



The Ontario Blue Jays host their spring training in Vero Beach, Florida at the Vero Beach Sports Village. This facility is formerly the historic Dodgertown complex, the long-time spring home of the Los Angeles Dodgers prior to their move to Arizona in 2010. The Blue Jays are treated in Major League style with all players staying onsite in the villas once by the Major Leaguers.

The great advantage of having a facility such as the Vero Beach

Sports Village at our disposal is that it affords us to get a significant amount of work accomplished over the high school March Break. Not only do our players stay on-site, but all of our meals are prepared in the dining room by the Dodgers former chef.

Having our accommodations, meals and fields together is extremely valuable as we prepare for the season. It allows for an extraordinary amount of work in a relatively short period. In addition to major league

fields, the dining room and private villas, Blue Jays players at various ages are afforded access to the other big league amenities including the Major League Clubhouse, Weight Room, Athletic Therapy Room and Laundry Facilities.

Another staple of Spring Training is top quality competition for all teams. Our youngest teams compete against top high school competition while our older teams

compete against U.S. colleges and Universities. In addition we have an annual game against the New York Mets as well as other professional competition for our players including games against the World Free Agents, Florida West Coast Free Agents and the Dominican Prospect League. Other past Spring Training opponents have included the University of Florida in Gainesville, Florida Tech University in Melbourne as well as Penn State University amongst other top college programs.

ONTARIO'S TOP AMATEUR PROGRAMS TO FORM NEW LEAGUE FOR 2016

Five top amateur youth baseball organizations have joined forces to form the Canadian Premier Baseball League (CPBL). The Ontario Blue Jays, Great Lake Canadians, Toronto Mets, Team Ontario and the Ontario Nationals are considered by many in the baseball community to be the top programs in Ontario by any measure and have decided to form this new entity in an effort to raise the level of competition and to offer their players better opportunities. The CPBL will offer the highest level of baseball at the 16 & under and 18 & under age groups while also affording their members the opportunity to branch out and offer their programs to talented younger players. Other high calibre teams from across Ontario will be considered for acceptance into the CPBL for its inaugural season and beyond.

In addition to offering the top competition in Ontario, the CPBL will be hosting a National Championship beginning in 2016 with invitations being extended to top programs across the nation. This is an effort to unite the top teams in Canada regardless of their league or affiliations. As well, the CPBL fully expects to become a destination for American teams wishing to come north of the border for top competition as the league will sponsor the CPBL Can-Am Classic tournament in its inaugural year.

The members of the CPBL represent the premier programs in Ontario. The past two seasons these members have accounted for 11 out of the 12 high school players drafted in Ontario as well as 18 out of the 21 players selected overall from Ontario including alumni players in college. In 2014 every single player drafted from Ontario in the Major League Baseball Draft played for one of the original CPBL member franchises. Notably the drafted players this year include 1B Josh Naylor (Mississauga, ON) from the Ontario Blue Jays who was chosen in the 1st Round this year by the Miami Marlins, OF Miles Gordon (Oakville, ON) from the Great Lake Canadians who was selected in the 4th Round by the Cincinnati Reds and OF Tristan Pompey (Milton, ON) of the Toronto Mets who was drafted by the Minnesota Twins and is the younger brother of OF Dalton Pompey, who is considered one of the top prospects in the Toronto Blue Jays organization. 2014 saw OF Gareth Morgan (Toronto, ON) from the Ontario Blue Jays selected in the 2nd Round by the Seattle Mariners as the top high school player from Canada while the nation's top college player selected was RHP Brock Dykxhoorn (Goderich, ON) who was a graduate of the Ontario Nationals.

In addition to the success of the players in the Major League Baseball Draft, the CPBL member teams have had extraordinary success placing players in college and watching their alumni succeed at that level. Notably this year Toronto Mets graduate Connor Panas (Toronto, ON) was MAAC Championship MVP and an ABCA/Rawlings All-American while at Canisius College. As well, Ontario Blue Jays graduate SS Daniel Pinero (Toronto, ON) led the University of Virginia Cavaliers to their 2nd straight College World Series where he has started every game in Omaha for them the last two seasons as a freshman and sophomore.

The CPBL members are also very well represented when it comes to Team Canada. This season 19 of the 22 players from Ontario to appear on the Junior National Team have come from member organizations while during the 2014 season, 21 out 24 Ontario players belonged to the original CPBL member teams.




to participate in this event that attracts the most scouts and college coaches of any amateur baseball event anywhere.

POST SEASON

While the focus of the Ontario Blue Jays program is on player development, that is generally construed as individual skills. While for the large part that is true, a key component of the Ontario Blue Jays program is post-season play. In addition to the individual skills, teaching the players to be a part of a team and achieve a team goal is a key facet of the program. Each year, Ontario Blue Jays teams qualify in U.S. post-season tournaments as they learn to compete at the highest levels of




amateur baseball in pressure packed environments.

The Ontario Blue Jays are members of the American Amateur Baseball Congress (AABC). Each year by advancing through the Premier Baseball League of Ontario (PBLO), Blue Jays teams qualify for the AABC North Atlantic Regional which at the 16 & under level is known as Mickey Mantle and at the 18 & under level is called Connie Mack. The North Atlantic



Mickey Mantle Regional tournament is held in Waterbury, Connecticut each year and the winner of the Regional advances to the AABC Mickey Mantle World Series in McKinney, Texas. The Blue Jays have done so in 2002, 2004, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013, 2014 and 2015 having become the first Canadian team to win a AABC World Series in 2013 by winning the Mickey Mantle World Series over California. 

The Blue Jays have appeared in the Connie Mack World Series 4 times — 1996, 1997, 2001 and 2010. The Ontario Blue Jays are also fortunate of having National recognition across the United States which gives us access to some very unique and exciting opportunities for post-season play for all of our teams including the AAU National Championships in Fort Myers,

Florida in which our 17 & under team reached the Championship Game in 2013, the USSSA World Cup in Kissimmee, Florida as well as the B.E.S.T. National Championship which our 18 & under team won in 2013 in Pensacola, Florida. Past post-season tournaments have included the USSSA 17 & under World Series in Oklahoma City which we won in 2005 becoming the first Canadian team to win any U.S. amateur World Series event.

The Ontario Blue Jays are fortunate enough to have accumulated a lot of success and history that we are invited to top events across the United States throughout the summer.

Typically the Ontario Blue Jays head south to where the best baseball is played. One of the staples of summer has been the All-American Classic in Memphis, Tennessee hosted by the Memphis Tigers. This has proven to be an excellent tournament not only in



terms of competition but also exposure as scouts and colleges from across the country make this a regular stop.

Another tournament the Ontario Blue Jays appear regularly in is the Heartland Classic in Oklahoma. Featuring top players from the southern Midwest, the Heartland Classic has been a great way for Ontario Blue Jays teams of the past to kick off their summer travel schedule.



The Ontario Blue Jays also regularly appear at Perfect Game events in Georgia and Florida as well as B.E.S.T. tournaments throughout the south including Florida and Alabama as well as AAU & USSSA Championships in Fort Myers and the Orlando, Florida area respectively. TRANSPORTATION

Safety and comfort are the two basic philosophies of the Ontario Blue Jays when it comes to travel with our older teams. Proud to have a partnership with Coach Canada, the Ontario Blue Jays have multiple buses branded with our decals. All of our travel takes place on our "OBJ" buses. This done for two reasons – first we do not believe in having staff or other adults drive vans or other vehicles long distances for safety purposes and second the bus becomes our home on the road so to speak and you



only have to ask any current or former player about the team building and bonding that occurs on trips of these nature. We honestly feel this is a part of our on-field success that our players grow together when they are in such close proximity to their teammates.

All of our buses include televisions, a DVD player, card table, air conditioning and a bathroom while our feature bus has satellite and



wireless internet in addition to outlets. All drivers are screened through personal interviews to ensure we end up with only the best and most professional drivers while we travel across the United States.

Our younger teams will have an opportunity to travel with their families until they reach the 16 and under level at which point they will ride the buses with their teammates.

HOTELS & ACCOMMODATIONS



Travel is a big part of the Ontario Blue Jays program. We pay particular attention to our accommodation to ensure that the players are in clean, safe and high quality locations.

Generally we stay at hotels that provide a nutritious and convenient breakfast each morning and most often we stay with Marriott Hotels or the Holiday Inn brand. Particular care is taken to make sure there are a variety of meal options in the vicinity of most hotels. We also take pride in exposing our players to a variety of

different experiences and hotels are a big part of this. While at the Perfect Game in Jupiter we have stayed at the PGA National Resort and Spa as well as the Doubletree. Presently we stay at Marriott's Singer Island Beach Resort and Spa as a season ending reward for our oldest players. The resort is about 15 minutes away from the Roger Dean Complex and is 5-stars in every regard. Players stay in on-site condos at the beach front property that feature two bedrooms with a full kitchen and laundry rooms and two full bathrooms as they overlook the Atlantic Ocean. These accommodations are quite obviously

well received by our players after a lengthy season.

Players on our 10 and under through 15 and under teams will have a chance to travel and stay with their families during the summer schedule before experiencing the camaraderie of rooming with teammates when they reach the 16 and under level and beyond with the Ontario Blue Jays.





Dan Bleiwas General Manager Head Coach of 18U

Dan Bleiwas has been coaching in the Ontario Blue Jays organization since September of 1999 and has been the Head Coach of our 18 and under team since 2001. In addition to his coaching responsibilities, Dan also serves as our Director of Baseball Operations and oversees all day-to-day aspects of the organization. Dan currently serves as a scout with the Cincinnati Reds

organization. Previously he was a scouting supervisor for the San Diego Padres from 2003 - 2009. He started in professional baseball as an associate scout with the Atlanta Braves in 1998.

Dan's prior coaching experience includes serving as an assistant coach, then Head Coach at York University from 1996 - 2002. He was selected Canadian Intercollegiate Baseball Association Coach of the Year in his first

year as Head Coach in 1998. Dan started coaching at the local level in Thornhill, Aurora and Markham as well as with Team Ontario (Youth Team) winning multiple National Championships along the way. Dan has also served as a guest coach with the University of Florida Gators baseball camps as well as Team One, the Area Code Games and Perfect Game USA.

Dan has coached over 400 players who have gone on scholarship to U.S. colleges and universities as



as well as over 50 players who have played professionally as well as 75 who have played on Team Canada. Amongst the players he has coached are Canadian Major League players George Kottaras, Scott Thorman, John Axford, Chris Leroux and David Davidson as well as the following Major Leaguers in the U.S. Adam Jones, Nate McLouth, Billy Butler, Bobby Keppel, Dustin Mosely and Jo Jo Reyes.

Recently Dan led the Ontario Blue Jays while having the most players selected in both the 2012 and 2013 Major League Baseball drafts of any Canadian team with 7 and 6 players selected respectively in those drafts.

On field in addition to the success his individual players have had, Dan has led the Ontario Blue Jays to numerous championships including appearances at the American Amateur Baseball Congress (AABC) 18u Connie Mack World Series in 2001 and 2010 having won the North Central and North Atlantic Regional Tournaments in each year to advance. The Ontario Blue Jays 18u team has won the Premier Baseball League of Ontario Championship every year since the league's inception in 2003. The Ontario Blue Jays have had tremendous success at U.S. tournaments as well having won Championships in Florida, Alabama, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Missouri, Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Pennsylvania, New York, West Virginia and Kentucky. On a National scale Dan's teams reached the Championship Game of the All-American Classic in Memphis, Tennessee and the Sweet Sixteen at Perfect Game's World Championship in the past season.

Dan is a graduate of York University (1998) and is married to the former Lesley Greenberg and they have two daughters; Riley, 8 and Madison, 5. Dan resides in Thornhill.



Sean Travers Director of Player Development Head Coach of 16U

Sean Travers was appointed Director of Player Development in 2002. During his tenure the Ontario Blue Jays have been to countless Regional Qualifying tournaments including five AABC World Series appearances both at the 16U (5) and 18U (1) levels. In 2007 the 17U captured the USSSA World Series title. In 2013, the

Ontario Blue Jays became the first Canadian team to win a American Amateur Baseball Congress World Series, winning the AABC Mickey Mantle World Series in McKinney, Texas.

Travers involvement with camps (counselor) begun in 1990 when he first started with Doyle Baseball School located in Orlando, Florida. From there he went on to organize and run Ontario Youth Baseball Camps

(Mississauga, Ontario) with Andy Lawrence (Former Player and Scout

with the New York Mets.) In 1996 after a successful colligate career and a championship win with the Johnstown Steel of the Frontier League (Professional Baseball) Travers, created and became the director of the Cito Gaston Baseball Academy. In the first Cito Gaston baseball camp over 40 players received scholarship



opportunities to American colleges to pursue baseball. Including current Major League player Pete Orr.

Travers baseball career began in Mississauga, Ontario and continued on throughout his teenage years where he was a three sports star in high school. Baseball, Football and Basketball. Travers went on scholarship to play baseball at Texarkana Junior College in Texarkana, Texas playing for legendary college baseball coach Dave Van Horn (Currently serving as Head Baseball Coach at the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville, Arkansas.) Travers then went on to play baseball at Dallas Baptist University (Dallas, Texas) under guidance of Head Coach Jim Harp. Travers hit over .390 in 3 years at Dallas Baptist, including twice being named All Region and one NAIA World Series appearance. In 1995 Travers was named Dallas Baptist Student Athlete of the Year. Travers earned a BBA in Business Administration.

I met Sean as a 15 year old, average baseball player, and with is coaching and guidance was able to play elite baseball for the Ontario Blue Jays, 7 years of professional baseball with Montreal, Washington and Toronto, and am now in my 4th year scouting with the Jays organization. Sean has a unique combination of immense knowledge, accountability, honesty and an innate ability to relate with every one of his players. In the nearly 15 years I have known him, I have yet to see a player he has worked with do anything but improve and succeed beyond their expectations. Sean is an asset to the Ontario Blue Jays organization, one of the best instructors in the game of a baseball, and someone I am lucky to call my friend and mentor."

Mike Steed is the former 18U Field Manager, Pitching Coordinator, and College Placement Advisor for the Oakville Royals. He has also spent three seasons as Field Manager with the Thunder Bay Border Cats of the Northwoods League. In addition, he has coached seven season of


